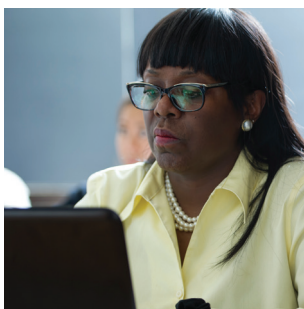
## Dominican University's Master of Arts in Teaching program is designed to develop and support innovative teachers and leaders as they navigate the changing world of secondary education.

- Online application
- \$25 application fee
- Two letters of recommendation from professional references
- Written personal statement
- A minimum GPA of 3.00 as evidence by official copies of transcripts from all colleges/universities attended
- A passing score on the Illinois Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP) and content test related to the area of licensure being sought. Note: An Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) qualifying ACT or SAT may be acceptable in place of a passing score on the TAP.
- A major in an area approved by the state.
